- a Ensure its governance reflects a genuine partnership model between Māori and non-Māori which is mana-enhancing and embodies collective power sharing.
- b Promote Hauora Māori and system transformation as central to realising equitable rural health outcomes.
- c Provide a diverse, representative voice for students interested in improving health and wellbeing outcomes for all rural communities and be a highly valued leader in this field.
- d Promote rural health careers to, by engaging and encouraging, tertiary and pre-tertiary students expressing an interest in practising in the rural healthcare field.
- e Engage broadly, forming partnerships with schools, tertiary education institutions, rural communities, Māori communities, and the rural health workforce, for the benefit of current and future tertiary students.
- f Advocate for rural students, particularly rural Māori students, to ensure tertiary institutions continue to utilise policies and entry pathways that produce an equitable health workforce for current and future rural communities.
- g Participate and contribute to research and initiatives that enhance healthcare provision and equity for rural communities.
- h Bring an informed and united rural student perspective to the HTRHN Council.
- i Identify key strategic issues pertinent to the Chapter and take these to the HTRHN Council for consideration and prioritisation for including in the annual workplan of HTRHN.
- j Maintain flexibility in our structure and approach, so our vision and goals represent the changing realities of rural health and education landscapes.
- k Under this Charter the Board and Council delegates to the Chapter and its Chapter Committee certain purposes, principles, functions and powers of HTRHN.
